






Warrant Article

• To see if the Town of Carroll will vote to raise and appropriate Four Million, Four Hundred Fifty Five Thousand Dollars (\$4,455,000) (gross budget) for the purpose of financing the construction of new Town Hall and Public Safety buildings; the new Town Hall building will include administrative offices, the Town Library, Historical Society and Community Room; the Public Safety building will include Police Department, Fire-Rescue Department, and Emergency Management Services; the buildings to be located on Town-owned land (Map & Lot 206-018-000-000); to authorize the issuance of bonds or notes in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) in the amount of Four Million, Two Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (\$4,205,000); to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue, and negotiate, sell and deliver such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, obtain, accept and expend any federal, state or other aid, grants, rebates, gifts or other revenues as may become available for the project and to comply with all laws applicable to said project; to authorize the Board of Selectmen to take any other action or pass any other vote relative thereto; to authorize the withdrawal of the sum of Two Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$230,000) from the New Land and Building Capital Reserve Fund for use on this project; and to authorize the withdrawal of the sum of Two Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) from the New Land and Building Capital Reserve Fund for use on this project; and to authorize the withdrawal of the sum of Two Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) from the New Land and Building Capital Reserve Fund for use on this project; and to authorize the withdrawal of the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) from the Library Improvement Capital Reserve Fund for use on this project.
