TOWN OF CARROLL SENIOR WATCH PROGRAM

The Carroll Police Department is rolling out a new Senior Watch Program.

The Senior Watch Program provides a daily health and well-being check for Town residents enrolled in the program. Participants are required to call the Carroll Police Department each day by 11:00 am at 846-2200. If the participant fails to check in, a Carroll Officer will make an attempt to contact the participant.

If the Officer does not make contact with the participant the Officer will respond to the home for a welfare check of the participant.

To participate in this program, the potential participant must:

- Reside within the Town of Carroll.
- Be 62 years of age or older; or 55 years of age and have a disability or a life- threatening injury/illness.
- Fill out an application.
- Provide a key holder who can allow access into the residence.

In order for the program to be efficient, it is imperative that participants are consistent in making their daily calls into the Police Department and notify the Police Department if they are going to be out-of-town due to vacations, hospital stays, etc. as well as notify the Police Department upon their return.

This program is intended to provide residents living alone with a sense of security and confidence that assistance is nearby should they need it. All information provided will remain confidential.

Late First Lady Barbara Bush would be fitting.

BARBECUED CHICKEN

3lb. quartered chicken	1/2 tsp. fresh ground pepper
1 lg. clove of garlic, crushed	1 Tbs. oil
1 tsp. salt	3 Tbs. lemon juice

Put ingredients in a heavy zip lock bag. Shake to coat well. Refrigerate for 24 hours, if possible, turning the bag several times. When grill is ready, place chicken skin side up, basting with marinade. Cook until well browned before turning. (If baking in oven, bake at 400 degrees, skin side down first). About 20 minutes before chicken is done, begin using Barbara's homemade barbecue sauce and enjoy.

BARBECUE SAUCE		
	¼ cup cider vinegar	1/2 tsp. each of salt and pepper
	2 ¼ cup water	1/2 cup Worcestershire sauce
	¾ cup sugar	2 ½ cup catsup
	1 stick butter or marg.	6 to 8 Tbs. Lemon juice
	1/3 cup yellow mustard	cayenne pepper, to taste

2 onions, chopped

In a saucepan put vinegar, water, sugar, butter, mustard, onion, salt and

pepper, bring to boil, cook over low heat for 20 minutes or until onions are tender. Then add rest of ingredients and simmer slowly for 45 minutes. Taste for seasoning. This sauce freezes well.

?? DID YOU KNOW ??

Last year, the Transfer Station needed a new Bobcat loader and it was approved and purchased. Greg Hogan, Public Works Supervisor, applied to NH The Beautiful, Inc. for a Grant to try and get help to defray the cost. On April 1, this year, we were delighted that Greg advised he was notified that the Town of Carroll was awarded \$5,000!

Thanks, Greg, for your effort – it paid off!

We'd also like to call your attention to the fact that recycling does indeed help – not only to reduce the amount of trash going into our landfills, but when it is sold, we are able to put the money toward a future expense, such as equipment. Greg also notified us that we recently sold baled cardboard and it paid \$1,417.61. This money has been deposited into the Special Revenue Fund and will be used to help save taxpayer dollars when the time arises that we again need a piece of equipment, etc. (This also applies to plastic, aluminum cans, and any number of items which we recycle!) Historical Society Looking for Town of Carroll Annual Reports

The Twin Mountain-Bretton Woods Historical Society recently learned that Town of Carroll annual reports from about 70 years are available online in digital format.

The University of New Hampshire Library maintains a collection of digitized New Hampshire Cities and Towns documents. Digitized Town of Carroll annual reports (spanning from 1898 to 2003) can be viewed at https://www.library.unh.edu/search/digital/%2A%3A%2A?f%5B0%5D=category%3ANH%20Cities%20%26%20Towns/Carroll%2A.

However, the UNH collection is not complete.

Historical Society member Mike Gooden searched the archives and his own personal collection, and located paper copies for all but 8 reports missing from the UNH collection. Those annual reports missing include 1897, 1900, 1902, 1905, 1907, 1913, 1914, and 1917.

Building Committee April 2019 Update

<u>Thank you</u>, Town of Carroll voters, for your support of the building project proposal. And <u>thanks</u> to our public safety forces and town employees, the Select Board, members of the Building Committee, Phase 1 Project Manager Allan Clark, and the many volunteers who have worked since late 2016 to make this project a reality.

On March 12, voters approved Article 8, the proposal to design, construct and equip a new public safety building for our police, fire-rescue, and emergency management departments and a New Town Hall for our administrative services, library, Historical Society, and a community room. The result was 212 "YES" votes to 107 "NO" votes, providing a 66.5% majority, exceeding the minimum 60% supermajority required for passage.

On March 13, the process began for the realignment of the School Street entrance to the new town complex. The town will seek a \$250,000 grant from the Northern Border Regional Commission to partially cover the creation of a new four-way intersection on US-302 at the driveway to St. Patrick's Church and removal of the current US-302 / School Street intersection.

On March 14, the Select Board approved a professional services contract proposal from Allan Clark, President of REI Service Corporation of Manchester and Sugar Hill, to act as Project Manager for Phase 2 of the project.

Mr. Clark has prepared and distributed RFPs (Requests for Proposal) for project financing, civil engineering services, and construction management services.

A total of five proposals were received in response to the financing RFP. On April 15, the Select Board voted unanimously to accept a project financing proposal from Bank of New Hampshire with a fixed 2.99% interest rate for 21 years. This very favorable interest rate resulted from the Town's current banking relationship and Mr. Clark's years of expertise working with Bank of New Hampshire.

The next steps will include the selection of a civil engineering firm to develop the site and a construction manager to complete the design/build process.

The Library welcomed Bill Emerson as a new Library Trustee in March. Bill will be acting as Secretary at the Trustees meetings. The meetings take place in the Library on the third Tuesday of the month at 12:30 and are open to the public.

Hooray! We are getting a new Library as part of the new Town Hall Building. Thank you to all who voted to support the new buildings. We anticipate a larger library space with an improved children's area and a comfortable seating area for meetings and Wi-Fi use. We will also have additional modern shelving as about half of the current shelves are built in to the existing town hall.

Our movie collection continues to grow with the acquisition of new titles every month. Recently, the Library has purchased more Marvel movies as the Marvel's Avengers 22 movie saga drew to a close with the release of *Avengers: End Game* in April. We also have *Green Book* which won best picture at the Oscars this year.
