Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the town zoning ordinance as follows: add definitions for the following terms: condominium; dwelling, two-family; dwelling multi-family; dwelling unit; junkyard; lot, corner; motor home; and amend the definition of "dwelling." *The full text of the amendment is available for review at the Town Office.*
